
EMPOWERED PATHWAYS: WERC

ROME FAMILY YMCA'S YCARE PROGRAM

The YMCA of the Greater Tri-Valley's/Rome Family YMCA's YCare program focuses on meeting the social, emotional, and academic needs of young learners so they can grow into the changemakers of tomorrow.

A child in their program, "Jace," was having trouble in school. The non-profit's caring staff worked closely with the student to identify what was causing Jace's behavioral challenges. After recognizing what was causing Jace's trouble in school, the solution was literally eye-opening and changed his life trajectory.

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HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS

INITIATIVES AND COMMUNITY COLLABORATIONS

Combating homelessness is a challenge far too significant for one organization to overcome on its own. Hundreds of local individuals are living each day with no place to call home.

As the collaborative applicant for our community's Housing and Urban Development (HUD) federal funding, United Way MV plays a vital role alongside several local non-profits working together to help house individuals and families in Oneida and Madison County.

Every day, United Way and our partners change a person's reality from homelessness to laying their head down at night in their new homes.

As a collective, we have major challenges to overcome to ensure everyone has a safe and stable place to call home. Federal funding only goes so far and doesn"t cover the cost of basic necessities needed in a new home. This year, United Way MV identified a way to fill some of that need with our Welcome Home Kits. We put together more than 100 totes filled with essentials a person needs to eat, sleep, and clean.

"United Way MV's Welcome Home Kits are a game changer for the clients we serve and much needed! RIDE UNITED

INITIATIVES AND COMMUNITY COLLABORATIONS

Transportation continues to be a barrier for many people in the Mohawk Valley. Without reliable transportation, it is a struggle for them to meet their basic needs.

We partner with several local non-profits to offer our Ride United transportation solution to their clients. Our Ride United program provides a new way to get to medical appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, a job, and more.



Getting Jace to School

When your vehicle doesn't start, it can cause a chain reaction of challenges. One is the cost of repairs or a new car. Most immediately, is the inability to get where you need to go. That was the case for one local 39-year-old Navy veteran and single father of two children. This was the only car he had to take the children to and from school. He discovered his vehicle needed costly repairs, and he couldn't repair it all at once. United Way was able to provide him with a Ride United pass for the month, allowing him to consistently bring his children to and from school while he did not have a working vehicle.



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INITIATIVES AND COMMUNITY COLLABORATIONS

211 navigates the maze of thousands of services to link our community members to help faster.

In times of crisis, any one of us can be unsure of where to begin to find help. 211 gives each caller one-on-one assistance from an experienced, highly skilled, and professionally trained navigator who:

- · Listens and responds confidentially.
- Assess the caller's needs and provide referrals.
- · Offers emotional support.
- Conducts follow-up.
- Advocates on the caller's behalf.

211 is available everywhere in New York State.

Locally, United Way of the Mohawk Valley leads the 211 service for Oneida, Herkimer, and Madison County. In our three-county area, there are hundreds of non-profits and more than 3,000 services listed in our 211 database, making it the most comprehensive listing of services available. This quite literally defines our local non-profit network and quantifies the sheer scope of the direct services they provide to help our community every day.

United Way MV is working with our NYS network to further 211's cohesiveness and accessibility through web and text statewide. This shift will bring a more universal and complete approach to help our community in times of need.
